A Truly Icelandic Adventure

The Islendingur (Icelander), a replica of Leif Eiríksson's ship, left Iceland June 17 for a commemorative tour of Eastern Canada, New England, and New York.

After sailing along the coast of Nova Scotia, the Islendingur is scheduled to arrive at Boston's New England Aquarium on Sept. 7. Events in the Boston area through Sept. 14 include: Theatrical performances, folk music, rowing competitions, a puppet show, and a conference on conservation and fisheries management.

The next stop for the Islendingur is Providence, R.I., for performances of Icelandic rock and opera and an Icelandic film festival from Sept. 15-19. Starting on Sept. 20, the ship proceeds to Mystic Seaport for a four-day long series of tours and historic presentations. From there, the vessel will visit New Haven on Sept. 28, Rye, N.Y. on Oct. 3, and New York City, where it docks at New York's South Street Seaport Museum on Oct. 5. On October 18 the ship sails to the 79th Street Boat Basin in New York City where the ship and crew will stay until the end of October for a citywide Icelandic Film and Cultural festival.

At each stop of the commemorative voyage, the public is invited aboard the Islendingur to meet the crew and Capt. Gunnar Marel Eggertsson, a direct descendant of Leif Eiríksson. Visitors to the ship will also gain a sense of the harsh conditions faced by the Vikings when they established the first European settlement in North America in 1000 A.D. Other dockside activities include VIP receptions, food festivals of Icelandic culinary specialties, and educational presentations for visiting school children.

New York events include Icelandic music at the South Street Seaport from Oct. 5-9, and a concert at Carnegie Hall on Oct. 9 by the Icelandic Symphony Orchestra. Also planned is a film festival, musical events, and plays at the soon-to-open American-Scandinavian Foundation's Scandinavia House Nordic Center at Park Avenue and 37th-38th Streets. Crew members will also be guests at the opening of the Viking Exhibition at the American Museum of Natural History on Oct. 21.

Although this schedule has been worked on for months it is still tentative in the sense that we welcome input and ideas that would contribute to the Voyage and the project as a whole.
