What is experimenting?

- **Traditional type of experimenting** is done either in a laboratory or with a finalized product or policy action.
- New way of experimenting is done in real environments with real users. Testing is a central development method throughout the process, starting from very early phases of development.
- Through this kind of testing, a policy or a service can be tested before scaling it.




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A two-year Experimentation Program



Experiment Government program program




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How would Design for Government -operational model look in practice?
